



Ignored Arab Christian Voices

Contextual Theology in the Era of Colonial Modernity

Within Palestine, Arab Christians are publicly visible as providers of religiously based discourses on social solidarity and the common good, for example in the form of contextual theologies. The paper reflects how far this has to be seen against the background of colonial history, and to what extent Arab Christians construct their socio-political identity in the context of entangled histories as well as the ongoing reality of socio-political crisis today.

Heidmarie Winkel is professor of sociology at the University of Bielefeld (Germany). She will present some highlights from her research as DAAD Visiting German Scholar based at the VHI, St Edmund's College, University of Cambridge. She specializes in sociology of religion, gender, and Arab societies.
