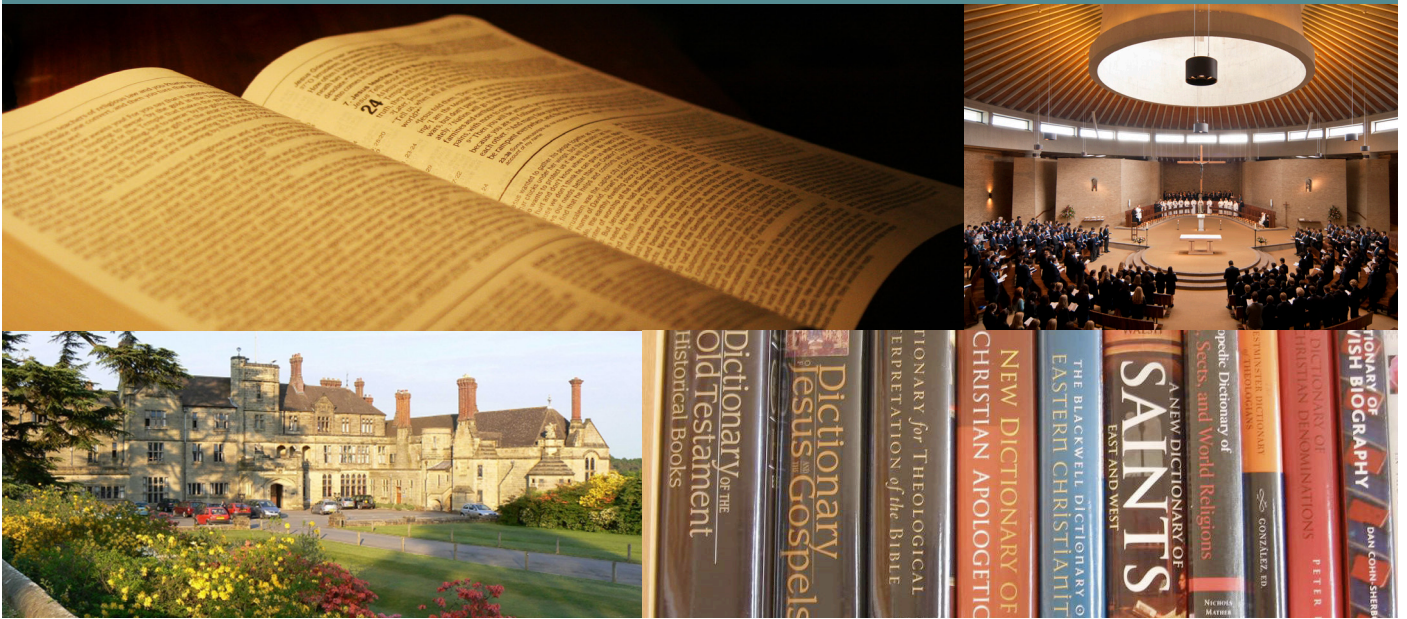


Theology+

We are delighted to welcome four leading academic theologians to give presentations and lead the discussions at the conference on the following topics:

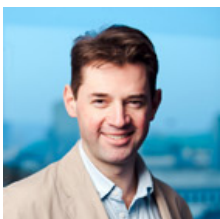


Professor Keith Ward | **Theology and Science**

Prof. Ward is a well known and experienced teacher of Philosophy and Theology. He has worked on issues of body and soul and the mind. He has written most recently on reason and Christian Theology and in defence of Idealist Philosophy.

Professor John Loughlin | **Theology and Social Justice**

John Loughlin is a Fellow of St Edmund's College, Cambridge and is Director of the Von Hügel Institute. He is a Senior Fellow of the Department of Politics & International Studies at Cambridge. He has carried out extensive research on the relationship between European politics and religion.

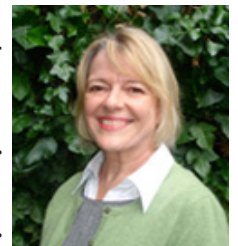


Professor Ben Quash | **Theology and Art**

Prof. Quash is Professor of Christianity and the Arts at King's College London. His work has focused on literature, drama, the visual arts, and music and their inherent theological value as well as the way in which the arts can stimulate renewed theological engagement with the Bible.

Professor Janet Soskice | **Theology and Creation**

Janet Soskice is Professor of Philosophical Theology at the University of Cambridge and a Fellow of Jesus College. Prof. Soskice's work has focused on Philosophy of Religion, particularly in Philosophical Theology and naming God. She has also carried out work in the fields of Jewish, Muslim and Christian relations and religion and gender.
