About the Von Hügel Institute

The Von Hügel Institute (VHI) is an interdisciplinary research institute based at St Edmund's College, University of Cambridge. The Institute was founded in 1987 to preserve and develop the Roman Catholic heritage of St Edmund's College, which was established in 1896 as a house for Catholic priests studying in Cambridge. The VHI carries out research on contemporary political, social, legal and economic issues from the perspective of Catholic social teaching. We are committed to an ecumenical approach working with Christians and other faith groups to respond to challenges to the common good and threats to human dignity and life.





The work of the VHI aims to inform Catholic social policy and practice to advance a more just and inclusive society.

Our research

Research is central to the Von Hügel Institute's mission. Over the past 25 years it has undertaken work on behalf of a wide range of organisations. These include the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, the Holy See's Mission to the UN, individual Catholic dioceses, the Charles Plater Trust (part of the Catholic Education Service of England and Wales), the Church of England, the British government and Regional Development Agencies. Our recent report on Catholic social teaching and the UK Government's 'Big Society' Programme was officially launched at the House of Lords in 2013. The Institute's research is disseminated in the form of books, articles, and working papers and VHI members are regularly invited to speak at high profile international conferences and to comment in the media on current affairs.

Our aim is to deepen the understanding of the relationship between Christianity and society.








Our activities
