Eamon Duffy FBA is an Irish historian, and Emeritus Professor of the History of Christianity and Fellow of Magdalene College in the University of Cambridge. He is the author of numerous works, including the celebrated Stripping of the Altars: Traditional Religion in England, c. 1400 - c. 1580 (Yale UP, 1992).
